Fred Perrine, Highway Superintendent, had submitted a written report. The Lake Rd. S. water main extension is completed. White Rd. restoration work will be done as soon as there is a break in the weather. The same is true for the rock crushing at the Town Park. Councilwoman Connors made a motion that the town donate 24 pieces of 6'length pipe and 2,500 bricks to the Capen Hose memorial monument at the fire station. Councilman Wheat seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Carried. Mr. Perrine recommends leasing a tractor and mower from ONTRAC Equipment. Monroe Co. is cutting funding for roadside mowing on county roads. Mr. Perrine gave three options for the town to follow. (Choice given following correspondence.) Work will begin at the Town Park. Summer hours will begin June 3rd. The department will work ten-hour days Monday through Thursday 6:00AM to 4:30 PM. The department secretary will remain on her schedule Monday through Friday to enable contact on Friday if necessary.

REPORTS

Councilman Carges met with Jim Oberst of MRB regarding the water main in the Sweden Town Park. The Monroe County Water Authority needs to look at the plans again. The generator purchased with the CDA grant is needed and has not been delivered yet.

Councilwoman Connors had no report.

Councilman Wheat reported that the golf gift card money is due on May 30th.

Councilwoman Windus-Cook had no report.

Supervisor Lester met with Fred Perrine, Paul Kimball and representatives from Wegmans regarding drainage and the flooding that occurs on the McBride property on East Canal Rd.
