A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Sweden was held at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York, on Tuesday, July 25, 2006.

Town Board Members present were Supervisor Buddy Lester, Councilperson Rob Carges, Councilperson Pat Connors, Councilperson Tom Ferris, and Councilperson Danielle Windus-Cook. Also present were Director of Finance Leisa Strabel and Town Clerk Karen M. Sweeting.

Visitors present were residents Jim Hamlin and Mary Ella Mulligan and student Brandon VanDuskirk from a Participation in Government class.

Supervisor Lester called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and asked everyone present to say the Pledge to the Flag. Supervisor Lester then acknowledged the presence of the visitors and asked if anyone would like to speak.

Resident Mary Ella Mulligan stated she was present to discuss the rumors circulating about the Senior Center. She said once she started attending the center she realized it provided many activities for seniors that don't have a lot of other things to do. The center gave seniors a chance to get out of the house and meet new people. Councilperson Ferris stated that the Town Board has no intention of closing the Senior Center and was curious as to where the rumors were coming from. Councilperson Connors stated that the Board's intention is to review the lunch program and find ways to enable that program to support itself and use less Sweden taxpayers' money. Many non-residents take advantage of the program but do not make any contribution to it. Ms. Mulligan agreed that some do take advantage of the center. She added that another concerned resident that met with Supervisor Lester shared some information at a meeting held at the center. The Senior Center staff is portraying the need for grants and other separate funding to assist the center. Supervisor Lester stated that the Board recognized the need to review the meal program due to Sweden taxpayers' paying for non-residents meals without any contribution from the non-resident. Mr. Lester reiterated that the Town Board has no intention of closing the Senior Center.

There were no further comments from the visitors.

Mr. Ferris attended the Disc Golf grand opening event and reported that approximately seventy (70) people were in attendance. Mr. Ferris stated that he listened to comments from experienced disc golf players and they were pleased with Sweden's course. The course is challenging because some holes are located in the woods. Mr. Ferris mentioned that Sweden's course is on a disc golf website. There is discussion of a winter tournament and the proceeds would be donated locally.
